Let us consider Gothic architecture. This style represented the High Middle Ages in Western Europe. It is generally said that it emerged from Romanesque and Byzantine forms in France during the later 12th century. Its great works are cathedrals, characterized by the pointed arch. The Gothic cathedrals depended for their enrichment chiefly upon sculpture and stained glass. Gothic architecture lasted until the 16th century, when it was succeeded by the classical forms of the Renaissance.

In France and Germany one speaks of the Early, High, and Late Gothic. The French middle phase is referred to as Rayonnant, the late phase as Flamboyant. It is of interest to note that in English architecture the usual divisions are Early English, Decorated, and Perpendicular.

Early English Gothic developed from c. 1180 to c. 1280. It was based on Norman and French antecedents. An old term for it was Lancet architecture. Early English Gothic was often characterized by lancet windows without tracery. Among its most important buildings are Wells, Lincoln, and Salisbury Cathedrals, Westminster Abbey, and the east transept of Durham Cathedral.
